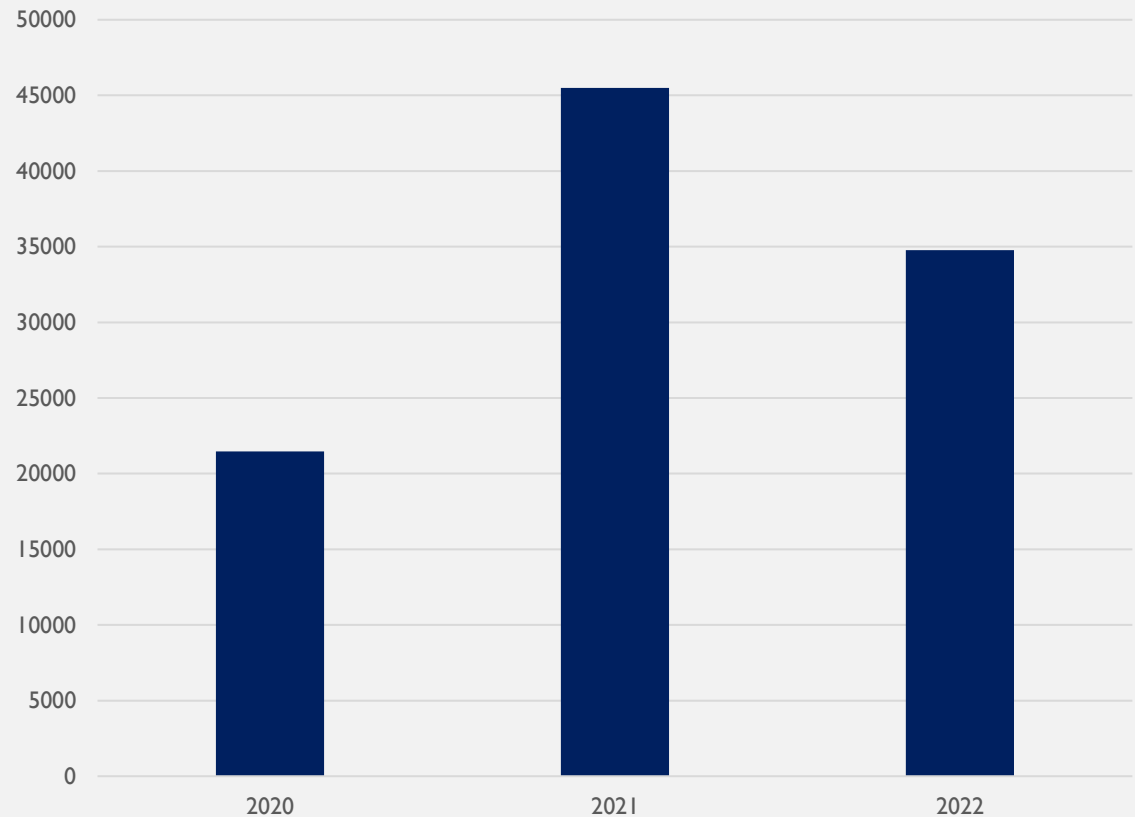

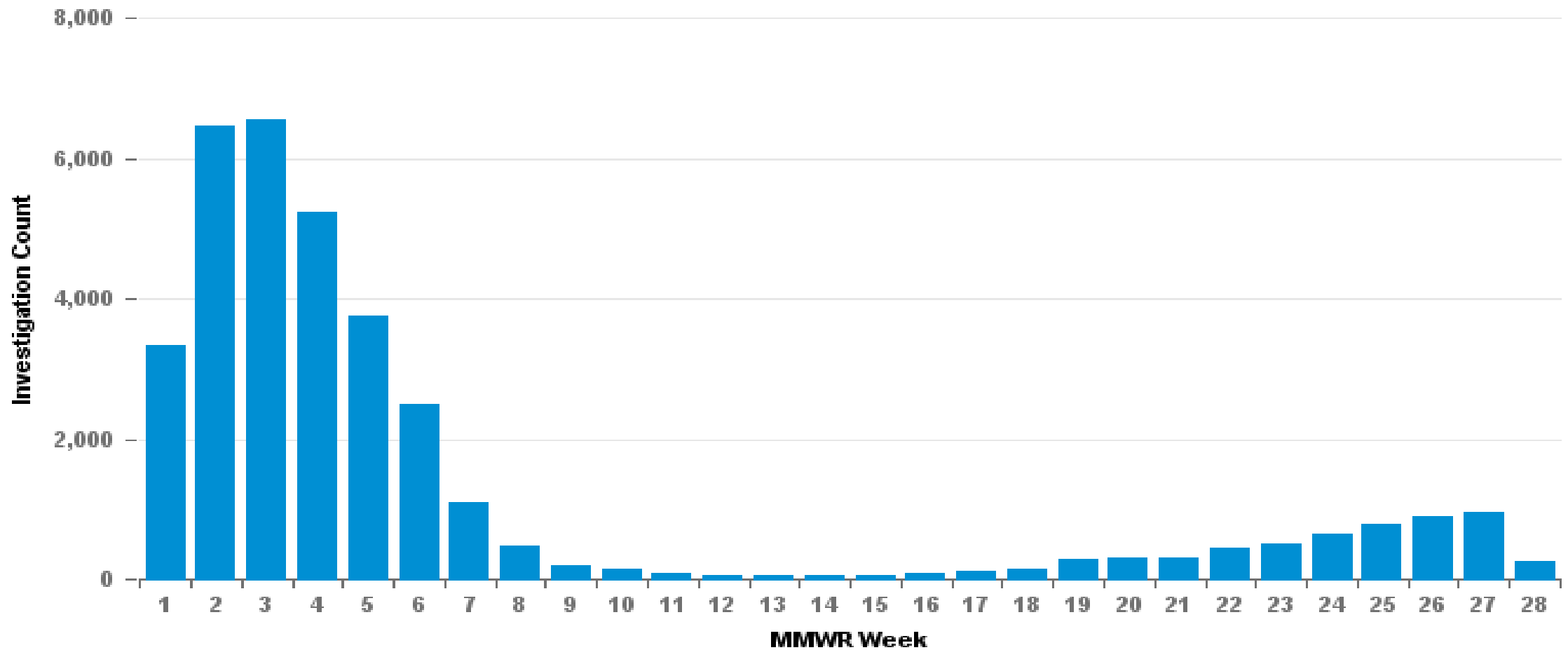

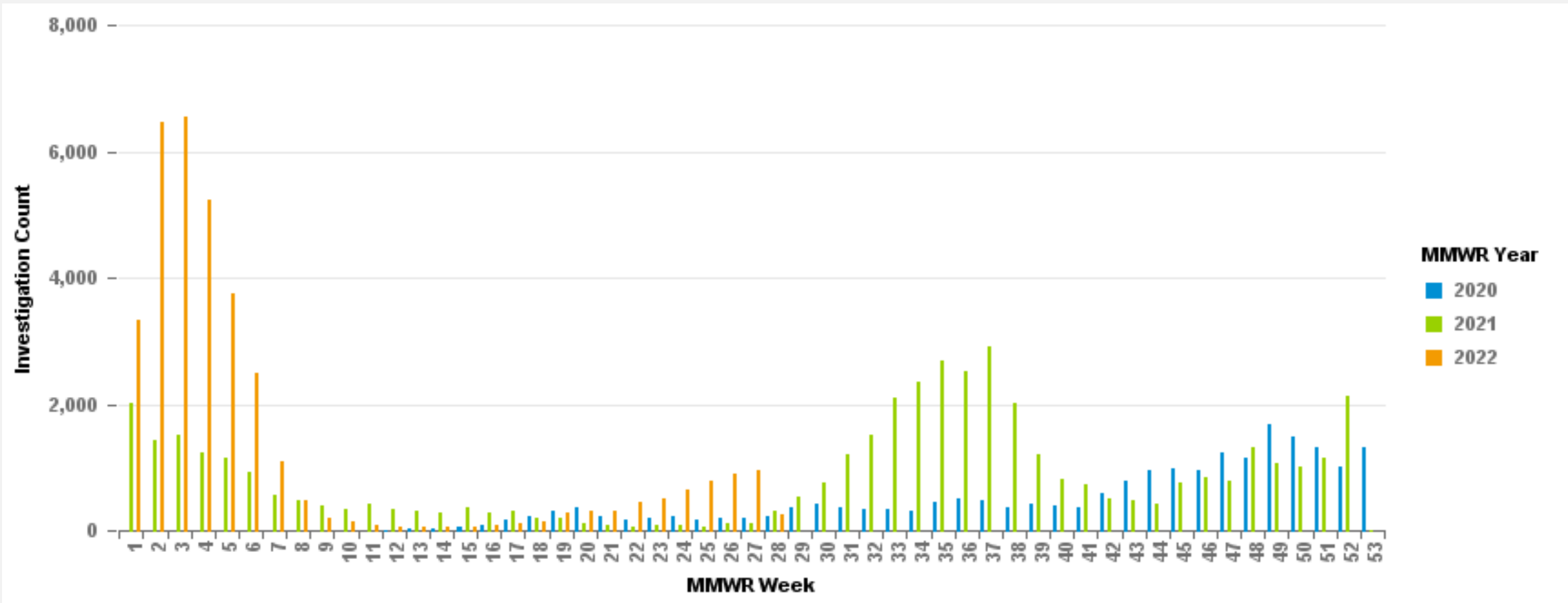
Total COVID-19 Cases in Region 4 by Year

Response from All Partners:
